following section:— *Section 82A.* Each officer in attendance upon the municipal court of the city of Boston who is appointed under section sixty-one shall receive from the county of Suffolk in full for all services performed by him the following salary:— The chief criminal court officer, fifty-nine per cent of the salary of the clerk of said court; the chief civil court officer and the assistant chief criminal court officer, fifty-six per cent of the salary of the clerk of said court; and all other court officers, fifty-three per cent of the salary of the clerk of said court.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect as of July first, nineteen hundred and fifty-one.

Chap.789 AN ACT AUTHORIZING DEDUCTIONS FROM WAGES OR SALARIES OF EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD AND OF CERTAIN TOWNS FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE UNITED FUND, SO-CALLED.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. In the city of Springfield and in the towns of West Springfield, Longmeadow, East Longmeadow, Wilbraham, Ludlow, and Agawam, deductions on pay-roll schedules from the salary of any employee of said city or towns in any amount which such employee may specify in writing to the treasurer of the city or of the town by which he is employed for the purpose of making a contribution to the United Fund, so-called, may be made subject to such rules and regulations as the respective treasurers of the city or towns may establish. Any such authorization may be withdrawn by the employee by giving such notice in writing of such withdrawal as the rules and regulations require to the city or town treasurer. The treasurer of the city or of the town by which such employee is employed shall deduct from the salary of such employee such amounts as may be certified on the pay-roll and transmit the sum so deducted to said United Fund. Money so deducted shall not be attached or taken upon execution or other process while in the custody of the treasurer of any municipality.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage, but shall not be operative after December thirty-first in the year nineteen hundred and fifty-two.

Chap.790 AN ACT MAKING CERTAIN EMPLOYEES ELIGIBLE FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

Emergency
preamble.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to make its provisions effective forthwith, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.
