

Chap. 346. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF FLOWERS AND CERTAIN POTTED PLANTS ON THE LORD'S DAY BY CERTAIN PERSONS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 6 of chapter 136 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the last paragraph, added by chapter 322 of the acts of 1950, and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph: —

Nor shall it prohibit the sale of flowers, including potted non-woody plants, or of fruit and vegetables by the person who raised the same, or by his agent thereunto duly authorized, on premises owned or leased by him.

Chap. 347. AN ACT EXTENDING THE APPLICATION OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE LAWS RELATIVE TO DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR TO ANY WAY OR PLACE TO WHICH MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC HAVE ACCESS AS INVITEES OR LICENSEES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Paragraph (a) of subdivision (1) of section 24 of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as amended by chapter 145 of the acts of 1938, is hereby further amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: — Whoever, upon any way or in any place to which the public has a right of access, or upon any way or in any place to which members of the public have access as invitees or licensees, operates a motor vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be punished by a fine of not less than thirty-five nor more than one thousand dollars, or by imprisonment for not less than two weeks nor more than two years, or both.

Chap. 348. AN ACT REDEFINING THE WORDS "RENOVATOR", "REUPHOLSTERER", "REMAKER" OR "REPAIRER", AS USED IN THE FURNITURE AND BEDDING INSPECTION LAW.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 270 of chapter 94 of the General Laws, as appearing in section 2 of chapter 611 of the acts of 1959, is hereby amended by striking out the paragraph defining "Renovator", "reupholsterer", "remaker" or "repairer" and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph: —

"Renovator", "reupholsterer", "remaker" or "repairer", a person who, either by himself or through employees or agents, is engaged primarily in the remaking or renovating of upholstered furniture, and shall also mean a person who, incidental to the business of remaking or renovating upholstered furniture, renovates or manufactures articles of bedding or furniture to be sold by him at retail. Such person shall not be bound by any provision of this law excepting section two hundred and seventy-three; provided, however, that if he manufactures upholstered furniture or bedding to be sold by him at retail, or renovates articles of bedding he shall also comply with the labeling provision of section two hundred and seventy-two, for such furniture or bedding.
