

Chap. 427. AN ACT PROVIDING LIFE TENURE FOR ANTHONY J. BELLIO, INCUMBENT OF THE OFFICE OF SECRETARY OF THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION OF BARBERS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section forty of chapter thirteen of the General Laws, the tenure of office of Anthony J. Bellio, incumbent of the office of secretary of the board of registration of barbers, shall be unlimited, but he may be removed therefrom for cause after hearing in the manner provided by section forty-three of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 428. AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE EAST VILLAGE SEWER CONSTRUCTION COMMITTEE IN THE TOWN OF WEBSTER.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. There shall be in the town of Webster a committee consisting of nine members, to be known as the East Village sewer construction committee. Said committee shall consist of the members of the board of sewer commissioners, ex officio, and six persons to be appointed by the selectmen. Said committee may make rules governing the time and place of its meetings and governing its organization and the conduct of its proceedings. Five members of said committee shall constitute a quorum, but a lesser number may adjourn from time to time.

SECTION 2. Said committee shall study the need for extending the sewer system in said town, shall obtain, subject to appropriation, engineer's estimates and reports relative to such need and relative to the construction of proposed sewer extension projects, and shall from time to time report to the town its recommendations with respect to such projects. Said committee is further authorized to acquire land for, contract for the construction of, and carry out, in all respects, such sewer extension projects as the town may from time to time direct, and the committee shall have, with respect to each such project, all the powers of the board of sewer commissioners, established under chapter three hundred and forty-five of the acts of eighteen hundred and ninety-eight; provided, however, that said board of sewer commissioners shall retain all its powers and duties with respect to all matters except the original construction of such sewer extension projects as the town may authorize the committee to undertake.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 429. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF NATICK TO PAY CERTAIN MEDICAL BILLS OF WILLIAM ROGERS, JOSEPH SAVIANO AND ROY WYMAN.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. For the purpose of discharging a moral obligation, the town of Natick may appropriate and pay the sums of seven dollars and three cents, two hundred and seven dollars and ninety-four cents, and
