**Abstract:** This collection documents Representative Draisen's legislative activities as a member of the Massachusetts House of Representatives during the early 1990s.

### SCOPE AND CONTENT

This collection documents Representative Draisen's legislative activities from 1991 to 1994.

*Series I. Correspondence* consists of correspondence to and from constituents and legislators.

*Series II. Subject Files* consists of material related to subjects of interest to Draisen and his constituents, including abortion, AIDS, domestic violence, economic development, and gay and lesbian civil rights.

*Series III. Legislative Files* includes House and Senate bills of interest to Draisen as well as legislation related specifically to condominiums.

## **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE**

Draisen was born in Boston in 1956. He graduated from Brandeis University with a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1978 and from Massachusetts Institute of Technology with a Master's Degree in City Planning in 1980. Prior to his terms as Representative, he was the Executive Director of the Citizens' Housing and Planning Association (CHAPA).

Draisen served two terms as State Representative from the 11th Suffolk District to the Massachusetts House of Representatives from 1991 to 1994. He was a member of the Joint Committee on Housing and Urban Development for both terms and, during his first term only, a member of the Federal Financial Assistance Committee. In 1991, Mr. Draisen was a founding member of the Progressive Legislators Group. In the 1994 Democratic Party primary, he was a candidate for the state-wide office of Lieutenant Governor.

Draisen's legislative priorities as Representative were consistent throughout his two terms: affordable housing, economic development, substance abuse, elder affairs, education, the environment, and issues pertaining to each community in his district: Boston, Brighton, Brookline, Roslindale and West Roxbury. Key bills sponsored (or co-sponsored) by Rep. Draisen that were enacted were the Condominium Reform Bill, the Pharmacy Freedom of Choice Act, and the Motor Voter Bill.

### A BRIEF BIOGRAPHY OF MARC DRAISEN

Marc Draisen is serving his second term in the Massachusetts Legislature, representing Brookline, Brighton, Roslindale, and West Roxbury. He is a member of the Joint Committee on Housing and Urban Development and a founding member of the Progressive Legislators' Group. Recently, Speaker Charles Flaherty appointed Representative Draisen to serve as his designee on the committee considering proposals for a "megaplex" sports complex in Boston.

Marc's leadership in the area of housing and community development goes back to the early 1980's, when he served as Director of Private Housing at the Executive Office of Communities and Development. There, he oversaw programs which built and renovated thousands of homes for senior citizens, first-time homebuyers, and people with disabilities.

### LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

As a legislator, Marc played a leading role in the adoption of legislation reforming the state's condominium statute and strengthening the power of housing receivers. He has consistently fought against budget cuts which have hurt the state's housing programs. Marc has also been active in the areas of substance abuse, economic development, the environment, and elder affairs.

As a legislator, Representative Draisen had an unusually productive first term in the Massachusetts House. His principal accomplishments include:

- passage of the first major reform of the state's condominium statute in the past thirty years; the law will strengthen the physical and fiscal position of condominium associations throughout the state
- passage of bill strengthening the power of court-appointed receivers to renovate dilapidated and dangerous residential buildings
- adoption of a statute enabling persons applying for government assistance to receive free copies of their medical records, as opposed to the exorbitant fees which were charged previously
- reform of Brookline's pension schedule, saving the town \$500,000 annually
- adoption of an amendment to fund detoxification centers, the first line of defense in the fight against substance abuse, over the opposition of the Weld Administration

This year, Representative Draisen is working on bills to allow Massachusetts residents to choose their own pharmacy without interference by insurance companies; to expand the supply of affordable housing in the Commonwealth; and to improve air quality by curbing the emissions of buses and trucks.

#### COMMUNITY SERVICES

Representative Draisen has a long history of community service, including the following:

- Founder of the Boston Oil Consumers' Alliance, a fuel buying cooperative which has saved over 4,000 members more than \$5 million during 10 years of operation.
- Executive Director of Citizens' Housing and Planning Association (CHAPA), 1987-1990. CHAPA is a statewide organization which advocates for the development and preservation of affordable housing.
- Past board member of Boston Aging Concerns/Young and Old United, a non-profit agency providing housing and services to senior citizens in Boston.
- Activist in the Jewish community, serving as a trustee of Temple Sinai in Brookline and an active member of the National Tay-Sachs and Allied Diseases Association.
- Secretary of the Ward 20 Democratic Committee, committed to electing Democrats from the West Roxbury and Roslindale neighborhoods of Boston.
