

Chap. 116. AN ACT DECREASING THE SIZE OF CERTAIN LETTERING TO BE USED ON CONTAINERS FOR THE SALE OF EGGS AT RETAIL.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 90D of chapter 94 of the General Laws, inserted by section 1 of chapter 393 of the acts of 1962, is hereby amended by striking out the fourth sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: — All eggs for sale at retail within the commonwealth shall be in containers so marked or branded, with letters not less than three-eighths of an inch in height.

Chap. 117. AN ACT INCREASING THE AMOUNT OF DEATH OR FUNERAL BENEFITS WHICH MAY BE PAID BY THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT POLICE RELIEF ASSOCIATION, INCORPORATED.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 96 of the acts of 1925, as amended by chapter 128 of the acts of 1960, is hereby further amended by striking out, in line 3, the word "fifteen" and inserting in place thereof the word: — twenty-five, — so as to read as follows. — The Metropolitan District Police Relief Association, Incorporated, a corporation duly established under general law, may pay death or funeral benefits not exceeding twenty-five hundred dollars, and disability benefits not exceeding thirty-five dollars weekly, any provision of law or of its charter to the contrary notwithstanding

SECTION 2 This act shall take effect as of January first, nineteen hundred and sixty-three.

Chap. 118. AN ACT REQUIRING THE REPORTING OF CASES OF CEREBRAL PALSY.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 111 the following section: —

Section 111A If a physician or hospital medical officer registered under section nine of chapter one hundred and twelve knows or has cause to believe that a person whom he is attending is afflicted with cerebral palsy, he shall give written notice thereof to the board of health of the city or town where the patient is being attended. Said board of health shall annually make such report to the department of the notices required under this section as the department by rule or regulation may prescribe. Such notices and such reports shall be solely for use of the boards of health and the department and shall not be open to public inspection or constitute a public record

Chap. 119. AN ACT RELATIVE TO TEMPORARY TRANSFERS IN THE CIVIL SERVICE.

Be it enacted, etc , as follows:

The first paragraph of section 15 of chapter 31 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the sixth sentence, as appearing in chapter 598 of the acts of 1960, and inserting in place thereof the follow-
