

Chap. 220. AN ACT TO PLACE ATTENDANT NURSES AT THE LONG ISLAND HOSPITAL DIVISION OF THE BOSTON HOSPITAL DEPARTMENT UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS AND RULES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The position of attendant nurse at the Long Island Hospital Division of the Boston Hospital Department shall be classified under the civil service laws and rules. The incumbents of the position shall have unlimited tenure of office subject, however, to said laws and rules.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by the city of Boston. *Approved April 4, 1963.*

Chap. 221. AN ACT TO GIVE TENURE TO INCUMBENTS OF POSITIONS OF LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSES IN THE EMPLOY OF THE BOSTON CITY HOSPITAL, THE BOSTON SANATORIUM DIVISION AND THE LONG ISLAND HOSPITAL DIVISION OF THE BOSTON HOSPITAL DEPARTMENT.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. No person permanently employed as a licensed practical nurse at the Boston City Hospital, the Sanatorium Division and the Long Island Hospital Division of the Boston Hospital Department, who has actually performed the duties of said position continuously for a period of six months, shall be discharged, removed, suspended, laid off, transferred from such office or employment without his consent, lowered in rank or compensation, nor shall his office or position be abolished, except for just cause in the manner provided in sections forty-three and forty-five of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws. The provisions of section forty-six A of said chapter thirty-one shall apply to any person so employed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by the city of Boston. *Approved April 4, 1963.*

Chap. 222. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF AN INJUNCTION FOR VIOLATION OF THE LAW RELATIVE TO UNTRUE, DECEPTIVE OR MISLEADING ADVERTISING.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 91 of chapter 266 of the General Laws, as amended by section 1 of chapter 217 of the acts of 1958, is hereby further amended by adding at the end the following paragraph: —

Whoever violates the provisions of this section may be enjoined therefrom by a petition in equity brought by the attorney general or any aggrieved party. *Approved April 5, 1963.*

Chap. 223. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE BOARD REGULATING GAS FITTING TO ELECT A CHAIRMAN.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The first paragraph of section 12H of chapter 25 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the first sentence, as appearing in
