Any member who is retired for disability under the provisions of section six or seven or who is retired under the provisions of subdivision (2) of section twenty-six, may elect to have his allowance paid in accordance with the terms of either option (a) or option (b) of subdivision (2) of this section.

Chap. 379. AN ACT DESIGNATING THE BRIDGE ON INTERSTATE HIGHWAY ROUTE 495 OVER THE MERRIMACK RIVER IN THE CITY OF LAWRENCE AS THE REVEREND JAMES T. O'REILLY, O.S.A. BRIDGE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The bridge on interstate highway route 495 over the Merrimack River in the city of Lawrence shall be known and designated as the Reverend James T. O'Reilly, O.S.A. bridge, in honor of the former pastor of St. Mary's church in said city, and a suitable marker stating such fact may be installed at a location acceptable to the department of public works and the federal bureau of public roads.

Chap. 380. AN ACT PROVIDING THAT PUBLIC HEARINGS BE HELD ON CERTAIN PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS OR EXTENSIONS OF THE METROPOLITAN PARKS DISTRICT, AND THAT DUE NOTICES THEREOF BE GIVEN TO MEMBER CITIES AND TOWNS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 57 of chapter 92 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding at the end the following paragraph: —

On or before November first of each year the commission shall after due notice to each member city and town of the district hold a public hearing on the subject of proposed improvements or extensions to its park system or on proposals for the construction or establishment of any new facilities. Such notice shall be given not less than ten days prior to the date of the hearing to the city or town manager, if any, of each city or town named in section thirty-three, otherwise, to the mayor or board of selectmen of each such city or town.

Chap. 381. AN ACT PROVIDING THAT PERMITS ISSUED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF FISHERIES AND GAME FOR COMMERCIAL SHOOTING PRESERVES SHALL EXPIRE ANNUALLY.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 112B of chapter 131 of the General Laws, inserted by chapter 620 of the acts of 1962, is hereby amended by inserting after the first sentence the following sentence: — Such permits shall expire annually on the thirtieth day of June.
