

**Chap. 420.** AN ACT MAKING PROVISIONS FOR REPORTS BY VOLUNTARY ASSOCIATIONS AND OTHER TRUSTS TO THE STATE SECRETARY.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 12 of chapter 182 of the General Laws, as appearing in section 2 of chapter 254 of the acts of 1954, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 2, the words "tax commission" and inserting in place thereof the word: — secretary.

SECTION 2. Said chapter 182 is hereby amended by striking out section 13, as so appearing, and inserting in place thereof the following section: — *Section 13.* The state secretary shall examine such report, and if he finds that it conforms to the requirements of this chapter, he shall endorse his approval thereon, and upon the payment of a fee of ten dollars shall cause this report to be filed in his office in book form for convenient reference, and open to public inspection.

SECTION 3. Section 14 of said chapter 182, as so appearing, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 2, the word "commissioner" and inserting in place thereof the words: — state secretary, and by striking out, in line 12, the words "tax commission" and inserting in place thereof the word: — secretary.

**Chap. 421.** AN ACT MAKING A CORRECTIVE CHANGE IN THE LAW RELATIVE TO THE REGISTRATION OF CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLES.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section 33 of chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the fourth paragraph, as appearing in section 1 of chapter 571 of the acts of 1959, and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph: —

For the registration of every motor vehicle and trailer owned by any political subdivision of the commonwealth, and used solely for official business, not exempt from the payment of fees as hereinbefore provided, three dollars.

**Chap. 422.** AN ACT PROVIDING FOR AN ADDITIONAL JUSTICE AND AN ADDITIONAL SPECIAL JUSTICE IN THE FIRST DISTRICT COURT OF EASTERN MIDDLESEX.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section 6 of chapter 218 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the first sentence, as appearing in section 1 of chapter 738 of the acts of 1956, and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: — Each district court other than the municipal court of the city of Boston shall have one justice, except that the central district court of Worcester, district court of Springfield, municipal court of the Roxbury district, the first district court of eastern Middlesex and the third district court of eastern Middlesex shall have two justices each.
