

being placed under the jurisdiction of a probation officer, or such other agency or authority as is deemed necessary. Any person released conditionally shall be subject to the jurisdiction of said court until discharged and such terms and conditions of release may be revised, altered, amended, revoked by the court at anytime, and such discharge shall not result until after due notice to the treatment center and the district attorney in the county where the commitment first originated from and the district attorney in the county where the person resides, or will reside, at the time of the hearing and discharge.

Chap. 609. AN ACT MAKING PERMANENT THE LAWS PROVIDING FOR TRIALS OF MISDEMEANORS BY JURIES OF SIX IN THE THIRD DISTRICT COURT OF EASTERN MIDDLESEX AND THE CENTRAL DISTRICT COURT OF WORCESTER.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 628 of the acts of 1964, as amended by section 1 of chapter 360 of the acts of 1966, is hereby stricken out.

SECTION 2. Section 2 of chapter 629 of the acts of 1964, as amended by section 2 of said chapter 360, is hereby stricken out.

Chap. 610. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TAKING OF FEMALE EGG BEARING LOBSTERS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter 130 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 41, as amended by section 1 of chapter 300 of the acts of 1963, and inserting in place thereof the following section:—

Section 41. Whoever takes, sells or has in possession any female lobster bearing eggs or any female edible crab or whoever has in possession any female lobster from which he knows eggs have been removed by any means other than natural hatching shall be punished by a fine of not less than fifty nor more than one hundred dollars for every such lobster or crab or by imprisonment for not less than one nor more than three months; but a person who takes any such lobster or crab and immediately returns it alive to the waters from which it was taken shall not be subject to such penalty. It shall not be a violation of this section to have in possession egg bearing lobsters spawning in fish cars or pounds if they are immediately liberated alive in the coastal waters, nor shall it be a violation of this section to take, sell or possess lobsters as provided in section forty-three.

Chap. 611. AN ACT DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES TO IMPROVE AND EXPAND THE FACILITIES OF THE RECREATION AREA WITHIN THE LOWELL-DRACUT STATE FOREST.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The department of natural resources is hereby authorized and directed to improve and expand the facilities of the recreation area located within the Lowell-Dracut state forest, and to expend for such purposes such sums as may be appropriated therefor.
