

that said commission has made a finding, which finding has become final, that a licensed broker or salesman committed an unlawful practice in violation of chapter one hundred and fifty-one B arising out of or in the course of his occupation as a licensed broker or salesman, shall suspend forthwith the license of said broker or salesman for a period of thirty days, and, if the said commission finds that said violation by such licensed broker or salesman occurred within two years of the date of a prior violation of said chapter one hundred and fifty-one B, which finding has been final, it shall so notify the board, and the board shall forthwith suspend the license of such broker or salesman for a period of ninety days.

Chap. 149. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE ORGANIZATION OF A REGIONAL REFUSE DISPOSAL PLANNING BOARD AND AUTHORIZING IT TO ACCEPT AND EXPEND FEDERAL FUNDS WITHOUT APPROPRIATION.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter 40 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out sections 44A and 44B, as amended by section 1 of chapter 748 of the acts of 1965, and inserting in place thereof the following two sections:—

Section 44A. A city or town, by vote of the council in the case of a city and by vote of a town meeting in the case of a town, may create a special unpaid committee to be known as a regional refuse disposal planning committee consisting of three persons to be appointed by the moderator in a town and by the mayor in a city.

Section 44B. Regional refuse disposal planning committees from any two or more contiguous cities or towns may join together to form a regional refuse disposal planning board. Such regional refuse disposal planning board shall study the advisability of establishing a regional refuse disposal district, its organization, operation and control, and of selecting, constructing, maintaining and operating a refuse disposal facility to serve the needs of the district, and shall estimate construction and operating costs and study methods of financing such district. Each city or town comprising such board may appropriate a sum not in excess of three thousand dollars for the purpose of meeting the expenses of the board. Such board may expend any such sums so appropriated and may employ such expert assistance as it deems necessary. Such board may apply for, accept and expend, without appropriation, grants or gifts of funds from the federal government. As used in this section and in sections forty-four C to forty-four K, inclusive, the term "refuse disposal facility" shall mean an incinerator, sanitary land fill, transfer station, composting plant, other sanitary means of refuse disposal approved by the department of public health, or any combination of two or more of such facilities.

Chap. 150. AN ACT INCLUDING A VIETNAM VETERAN IN THE DEFINITION OF "VETERAN" AS USED IN THE HOUSING AUTHORITY LAW.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 26J of chapter 121 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the paragraph defining "Veteran", as most recently
