

accidental death and dismemberment insurance and group general or blanket hospital, surgical, medical, dental, and other health insurance for its active or retired employees, or their dependents, unless such insurance is procured pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, or unless such payments are for part of the premiums for group life insurance for permanent employees as authorized by clause (44) of section five of chapter forty.

**Chap. 374.** AN ACT EXEMPTING REGISTERED NURSES FROM CIVIL LIABILITY AS A RESULT OF RENDERING CERTAIN EMERGENCY CARE.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section 12B of chapter 112 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by chapter 578 of the acts of 1965, is hereby further amended by inserting after the words "two A", in line 2, the following: — and no nurse duly registered under the provisions of section seventy-four or seventy-six.

**Chap. 375.** AN ACT PLACING THE POSITION OF EXECUTIVE SECRETARY TO THE PARK AND RECREATION BOARD OF THE CITY OF QUINCY UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 78 of the acts of 1961 is hereby amended by striking out the fourth sentence, as appearing in chapter 388 of the acts of 1962, and inserting in place thereof the following two sentences: — There shall be an executive secretary to said board, who shall be appointed, and whose duties shall be fixed, by said board, which duties shall not, however, include supervision over the recreational activities authorized by said board. The position of executive secretary to said board shall be subject to the civil service law and rules.

SECTION 2. The tenure of office of the incumbent of the position of executive secretary to the park and recreation board of the city of Quincy on the effective date of this act shall be unlimited, subject, however, to the civil service law and rules. Said incumbent shall be subjected to a qualifying examination by the division of civil service, and if he passes said examination, he shall be certified for said position and shall be deemed to be permanently appointed thereto without being required to serve any probationary period. If he fails to pass said examination, he may continue to serve in said position but shall not be subject to the civil service law and rules.

**Chap. 376.** AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARY OF THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY FOR THE SUFFOLK DISTRICT AND PROVIDING THAT HE SHALL DEVOTE HIS ENTIRE TIME DURING ORDINARY BUSINESS HOURS TO HIS DUTIES AND SHALL NOT ENGAGE IN THE PRACTICE OF LAW.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section 15 of chapter 12 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 743 of the acts of 1963, is hereby further amended by striking out, in line 3, the words "twenty thousand
