

Chap. 665. AN ACT DESIGNATING THE ATHLETIC PLANT IN THE CLEVELAND CIRCLE SECTION OF THE BRIGHTON DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF BOSTON AS THE JOHN A. RYDER SPORTS ARENA.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The athletic plant to be constructed by the metropolitan district commission in the Cleveland Circle section of the Brighton district of the city of Boston shall, upon its completion, be known and designated as the John A. Ryder Sports Arena, in memory of John A. Ryder, an outstanding track coach. A suitable marker bearing said designation shall be attached thereto by said commission.

SECTION 2. Chapter six hundred and forty-seven of the acts of nineteen hundred and sixty-four is hereby repealed.

Chap. 666. AN ACT EXTENDING FROM ONE YEAR TO TWO YEARS THE PERIOD WITHIN WHICH AN ACTION TO RECOVER DAMAGES FOR WRONGFUL DEATH SHALL BE COMMENCED.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 229 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the last sentence, as appearing in section 1 of chapter 238 of the acts of 1958, and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: — An action to recover damages under this section shall be commenced within two years from the date of death or within such time thereafter as is provided by section four, four B, nine or ten of chapter two hundred and sixty.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on January first, nineteen hundred and sixty-eight and shall apply only to actions for death resulting from injuries sustained or accidents occurring on or after said date.

Chap. 667. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION BY THE COMMONWEALTH OF CERTAIN PROPERTY IN THE TOWN OF DEDHAM FOR USE AS A GOVERNOR'S MANSION.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The commissioner of administration, on behalf of the commonwealth, is hereby authorized to acquire by gift for use as a governor's mansion the land and the buildings thereon located in the town of Dedham, known as the Endicott estate, bounded by Sanderson avenue, Mount Vernon street, East street and Walnut street.
