

best, to an amount to be specified by the governor from time to time, but not exceeding, in the aggregate, the sum of twenty-five million dollars. All bonds issued by the commonwealth, as aforesaid, shall be designated on their face, Metropolitan Water District Additional Loan, Act of 1967, and shall be on the serial payment plan for such maximum term of years, not exceeding fifty years, as the governor may recommend to the general court pursuant to Section 3 of Article LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth, the maturities thereof to be so arranged that the amounts payable in the several years of the period of amortization other than the final year shall be as nearly equal as in the opinion of the state treasurer it is practicable to make them. Said bonds shall bear interest semiannually at such rate as the state treasurer, with the approval of the governor, shall fix. The initial maturities of such bonds shall be payable not later than one year from the date of issue thereof and the entire issue not later than June thirtieth, two thousand and twenty-one. All interest payments and payments on account of principal on such obligations shall be part of the debt and expenses of the metropolitan water district.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

**Chap. 670.** AN ACT INCREASING CERTAIN FEES FOR MEDICAL EXAMINERS AND ASSOCIATE MEDICAL EXAMINERS.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 5 of chapter 38 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the last sentence, as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 301 of the acts of 1959, and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:— Medical examiners and associate medical examiners in other counties shall receive fees as follows: For a view without an autopsy, twenty-five dollars; for a view with an autopsy, fifty dollars; and for travel, ten cents a mile for each mile traveled in the investigation of a death; for attendance as a witness at inquests or as a witness in criminal cases in district courts and in the superior court, fifty dollars for each day of such attendance; and for travel, ten cents a mile to and from the place where such inquest or court trial is held.

SECTION 2. Section 16 of said chapter 38 is hereby amended by striking out the word "ten", inserted by section 2 of said chapter 301, and inserting in place thereof the word:— fifteen.

**Chap. 671.** AN ACT PROVIDING TENURE OF OFFICE UNTIL AGE SIXTY-FIVE FOR DAVID A. WERME, INCUMBENT OF THE OFFICE OF CHIEF OF POLICE OF THE TOWN OF BOYLSTON.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

The tenure of office of David A. Werme, incumbent of the office of chief of police of the town of Boylston, shall continue during good behavior until he reaches the age of sixty-five, unless incapacitated by physical or mental disability from performing the duties thereof, but he may be removed therefrom for cause after hearing in the manner prescribed by section forty-three of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.
