

**Chap. 33.** AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING VACATIONS FOR POLICE OFFICERS AND FIRE FIGHTERS IN CERTAIN CITIES AND TOWNS AFTER TWENTY YEARS OF SERVICE.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Chapter 41 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 111K the following section: —

*Section 111L.* In any city or town in which the provisions of section one hundred and eleven D apply and which accepts this section all members of its regular police or fire force may after twenty years of service be granted a vacation of five weeks without loss of pay.

*(This Bill, returned by the governor, to the House of Representatives, the branch in which it originated, with his objections thereto, was passed by the House of Representatives, March 5, 1968, and, in concurrence, by the Senate, March 6, 1968, the objections of the governor notwithstanding, in the manner prescribed by the constitution; and thereby has "the force of a law".)*

**Chap. 34.** AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE DISPOSITION OF CERTAIN BURIAL CERTIFICATES.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section 46 of chapter 114 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by chapter 465 of the acts of 1958, is further amended by striking out the second paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph: —

The board of health or its agent, or the superintendent or person having such care, shall, upon receipt of such certificate, forthwith countersign it and file it in his office. *Approved March 9, 1968.*

**Chap. 35.** AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY TREASURER OF ESSEX COUNTY TO PAY CERTAIN UNPAID BILLS.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the county treasurer of Essex county is hereby authorized to pay from any available funds in the county treasury such of the unpaid bills of said county, incurred eighteen months or more prior to the passage of chapter five hundred and twenty-nine of the acts of nineteen hundred and sixty-four, as appear on a list on file in the office of the director of accounts totaling three thousand one hundred twenty-eight dollars and eighty-nine cents.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

**Chap. 36.** AN ACT INCREASING THE AMOUNT TO BE PAID TO CERTAIN RECIPIENTS OF OLD AGE ASSISTANCE AND TO CERTAIN PERMANENTLY AND TOTALLY DISABLED PERSONS AS TRANSPORTATION ALLOWANCES.
