

Chap. 226. AN ACT DIRECTING THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HAMPSHIRE COUNTY TO PREPARE PLANS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW COURT HOUSE IN THE CITY OF NORTHAMPTON.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The county commissioners of Hampshire county are hereby authorized and directed to have plans, test borings and specifications prepared for the construction of a new court house in the city of Northampton. For said purposes, said commissioners may expend from any available funds a sum not exceeding twenty thousand dollars.

Chap. 227. AN ACT REDUCING THE REQUIRED AGE FOR EXAMINATION FOR A LICENSE TO OPERATE A CINEMATOGRAPH OR SIMILAR APPARATUS IN A PUBLIC BUILDING.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 75 of chapter 143 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by chapter 112 of the acts of 1950, is hereby further amended by striking out, in line 12, the word "twenty-one" and inserting in place thereof the word: — nineteen.

SECTION 2. Said chapter 143 is hereby further amended by striking out section 79, as amended by section 5 of chapter 553 of the acts of 1941, and inserting in place thereof the following section: —

Section 79. Any person over nineteen who presents to the commissioner of public safety an affidavit, signed and sworn to by him, stating that he has operated a cinematograph or similar apparatus in a booth or enclosure in a theatre or hall devoted to public exhibitions of moving pictures outside of the commonwealth for a period of three months or more, shall be eligible for the examination, as provided in section seventy-five, for a license.

Chap. 228. AN ACT AUTHORIZING CITIES AND TOWNS TO BORROW FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF LAND FOR BURIAL PURPOSES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 7 of chapter 44 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after clause (19) the following clause: —

(20) For developing land for burial purposes and for constructing paths and avenues and embellishing the grounds in said developed areas in a cemetery owned by the city or town, five years, ten per cent. The proceeds from the sale of the exclusive rights of burials in any of the lots in such cemetery shall be kept separate from other funds and be appropriated for the payment of any indebtedness incurred for such developments, notwithstanding the provisions of section fifteen of chapter one hundred and fourteen.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect as of January first, nineteen hundred and sixty-eight.
