

SECTION 2. Section 85 of chapter 276 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after the second sentence the following sentence: — Prior to the aforesaid disposition such record of the probation officer shall be made available to the defendant and his counsel for inspection.

**Chap. 334.** AN ACT CHANGING THE NAMES OF CERTAIN INSTITUTIONS UNDER THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE COLLEGES.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Chapter 73 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 18 the following section: —

*Section 19.* The institutions of higher learning under the jurisdiction of the board of trustees of state colleges shall be Boston State College, Bridgewater State College, Fitchburg State College, Framingham State College, Lowell State College, North Adams State College, Salem State College, Westfield State College, Worcester State College, Massachusetts College of Art and Massachusetts Maritime Academy.

**Chap. 335.** AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CERTAIN REGISTERED ASSISTANT PHARMACISTS SHALL, UPON APPLICATION, BE EXAMINED FOR REGISTRATION AS PHARMACISTS, AND IF THEY PASS SUCH EXAMINATION SHALL BE CERTIFIED AS REGISTERED PHARMACISTS.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section twenty-four of chapter one hundred and twelve of the General Laws, a person who holds a certificate of registration, issued by the commonwealth, as an assistant pharmacist and who has been continuously employed in a retail drugstore for a period of ten years or more immediately prior to the filing of an application for registration as a pharmacist hereunder, shall, upon application to the board of registration in pharmacy within two years of the effective date of this act and upon the payment of ten dollars to said board, be entitled to an examination for registration as a pharmacist. Upon passing such examination, such person shall be registered as a pharmacist, and shall receive a certificate of registration signed by the president and secretary of said board.

SECTION 2. Chapter six hundred and thirty-four of the acts of nineteen hundred and fifty-five is hereby repealed.

**Chap. 336.** AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CERTAIN LEGAL ADVERTISEMENTS REQUIRED UNDER ZONING LAWS SHALL CONTAIN MATTER PRINTED IN BOLD FACE TYPE.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section 17 of chapter 40A of the General Laws, as most recently amended by section 2 of chapter 201 of the acts of 1962, is hereby further amended by inserting after the first sentence the following sentence: —

The publication required by this section shall contain the following printed in bold face type: (a) the name of the petitioner; (b) the location of the area or premises which are the subject of the petition; and (c) the date and place of the public hearing. *Approved May 24, 1968.*

**Chap. 337.** AN ACT AUTHORIZING WILLARD PAGE JACKSON OF MARBLEHEAD TO BECOME A MEMBER OF THE RETIREMENT SYSTEM OF THE TOWN OF MARBLEHEAD.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Notwithstanding any provisions of general or special law to the contrary, Willard Page Jackson of Marblehead, assessor of the town of Marblehead, shall, upon application, be admitted to membership in the retirement system of said town; provided, that said Willard Page Jackson shall deposit in the annuity savings fund of said system such amount as the Marblehead retirement board may determine as being equal to that which he would have paid into said fund had he been a member of the retirement system at the time his service commenced, together with regular interest thereon. *Approved May 24, 1968.*

**Chap. 338.** AN ACT INCREASING THE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE OF CERTAIN CITY OR TOWN EMPLOYEES WHO RETIRE UNDER THE VETERANS RETIREMENT ACT.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 58C, inserted by section 1 of chapter 400 of the acts of 1967, the following section: —

*Section 58D.* In any city or town which accepts this section, if any city or town employee, other than a member of the police department or a permanent member of the fire department, who is a veteran, retires under section fifty-eight, he shall, in lieu of the retirement allowance provided in said section fifty-eight, receive a retirement allowance, if he retires before attaining age sixty, equal to seventy per cent, after attaining age sixty and before attaining age sixty-one, equal to seventy-one per cent, or after attaining age sixty-one, equal to seventy-two per cent, of the highest annual rate of compensation, including any bonuses paid in lieu of additional salary or as a temporary wage increase in addition to his regular compensation, and including any maintenance allowance, payable to him while he was holding the grade held by him at his retirement, and payable from the same source.

SECTION 2. In any city or town which accepts section fifty-eight D of chapter thirty-two of the General Laws, inserted by section one of this act, any person who had been retired as a veteran under the provisions of section fifty-eight of said chapter thirty-two prior to the date of such acceptance and who at the time of his retirement was an employee of such city or town, other than a member of the police department or a permanent member of the fire department prior to the date of such acceptance, shall have his retirement allowance adjusted so as to conform, from and after the date of such acceptance, to the provisions of said section fifty-eight D. *Approved May 24, 1968.*
