

Chap. 415. AN ACT CHANGING THE PURPOSES, AND ENLARGING THE SCOPE OF ACTIVITIES, OF THE EPISCOPAL CITY MISSION.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 2 of chapter 92 of the acts of 1844, as amended by chapter 179 of the acts of 1923, is hereby further amended by striking out, in lines 5 and 6, the words "instruction of the poor, and to the support of public worship in the county of Suffolk", and inserting in place thereof the words:—needs of the underprivileged and the support of public worship in the Diocese of Massachusetts, especially in Boston and in other urban areas.

Chap. 416. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF AN ALL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES LICENSE TO THE TURNERS FALLS EAGLES CLUB IN THE TOWN OF MONTAGUE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding any limitation on the number of licenses to be issued under the provisions of section seventeen of chapter one hundred and thirty-eight of the General Laws, but subject, however, to all other provisions of said chapter, the license commission of the town of Montague is hereby authorized to issue to The Turners Falls Eagles Club, a corporation duly established by law in the commonwealth, an annual club license to sell all alcoholic beverages, to be drunk on its premises, to its members and to guests introduced by such members and to no others.

Said license shall not be transferable to any other licensee and shall not be included in the number of licenses issued under authority of said section seventeen; provided, however, that if there is an addition to the quota of such licenses in said town under said section seventeen because of an increase in population in said town, then said license shall be included in such new quota.

Chap. 417. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF WEYMOUTH TO PAY A CERTAIN SUM OF MONEY TO HAROLD L. MOORE, A POLICE OFFICER OF SAID TOWN.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. For the purpose of discharging a moral obligation, the town of Weymouth may appropriate and pay the sum of two thousand three hundred and sixty-three dollars to Harold L. Moore, a police officer of said town, as reimbursement for legal expenses incurred by him in defending himself against legal proceedings instituted against him arising out of certain acts performed by him in the line of duty.

SECTION 2. Any action taken by the town of Weymouth at its annual town meeting held in the current year, pursuant to the authority granted by section one of this act, shall be as valid and effective as though this act had been in full force and effect at the time of the posting of the warrant for said meeting.
