Chap. 484. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SESSIONS OF THE PROBATE COURT FOR MIDDLESEX COUNTY IN THE CITY OF LOWELL.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 62 of chapter 215 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the paragraph amended by chapter 416 of the acts of 1950 and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph: —

Middlesex, at Cambridge, every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday between the second Monday of September and the fourth Tuesday of July, both dates inclusive, and the third Thursday of August; at Lowell each Friday of every month except August and except the first Friday of September.

Chap. 485. AN ACT DESIGNATING A CERTAIN BRIDGE IN THE TOWN OF WAREHAM AS THE JOSEPH R. BAPTISTA MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The bridge over the Wankinco river on state highway route 25 in the town of Wareham shall, upon completion, be known and designated as the Joseph R. Baptista Memorial Bridge, in memory of Technician 5th grade, Joseph R. Baptista, who died as the results of wounds received in action while a member of the armed forces of the United States in World War II. A suitable marker bearing said designation shall be attached thereto by the department of public works.

Chap. 486. AN ACT DIRECTING THE BUILDING INSPECTOR OF THE TOWN OF BRAINTREE TO ISSUE A PERMIT TO THE BRAINTREE HOUSING AUTHORITY TO CONSTRUCT A MULTIPLE HOUSING PROJECT FOR THE ELDERLY.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of chapters forty A and one hundred and forty-five of the General Laws, the building inspector of the town of Braintree shall issue a permit to the Braintree Housing Authority, if said authority acquires title to the parcel of land herein-after described, to construct a multiple housing project for the elderly of not more than seventy-five units, no building of which project shall exceed two stories, on land off Hayward street in said town as shown on a plan entitled, "Plan of land in Braintree, Mass.," dated December 8, 1947, Frank L. Heaney, Civil Engr., 49 Sherbrooke Avenue, Braintree, Mass., and more particularly described as Plots 28, 31, 32 and 33 of Assessor's Plan 3051, and containing 7.30 acres, more or less. The erection of buildings on, and the use of, said parcel of land shall conform

to the Section III Residence C, District Uses of the zoning by-laws of the town of Braintree, except where specific relief therefrom is granted by the zoning board of appeals.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 487. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TRUSTEES OF THE BRISTOL COUNTY HOSPITAL TO SELL THE PROPERTY OF THE BRISTOL COUNTY HOSPITAL AND NURSING HOME FOR THE AGING, ABOLISHING SAID TRUSTEES AND DISSOLVING THE BRISTOL COUNTY HOSPITAL DISTRICT.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter five hundred and twenty-two of the acts of nineteen hundred and forty-eight is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. Section 28A of chapter 35 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by section 3 of chapter 398 of the acts of 1945, is hereby further amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: — The county commissioners of each county, having a tuberculosis hospital established under sections seventy-eight to ninety, inclusive, of chapter one hundred and eleven, shall, in each year, prepare estimates of receipts of said hospital and of the cost of its care, maintenance and repair for the ensuing year in the form prescribed by the director of accounts and upon blanks furnished by him.

SECTION 3. The first sentence of section 82 of chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in section 2 of chapter 608 of the acts of 1961, is hereby amended by striking out, in the first sentence, the words “or in the case of Bristol county the trustees of the Bristol County Tuberculosis Hospital.”

SECTION 4. Section 87 of said chapter 111, as most recently amended by section 6 of chapter 608 of the acts of 1961, is hereby further amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: — The county commissioners shall be trustees of the institutions operated under section eighty-two.

SECTION 5. The office of trustee of the Bristol county hospital shall, on the effective date of this section, be abolished and the Bristol county hospital district shall be dissolved, and the terms of office of each of the trustees of said hospital shall terminate on said date.

SECTION 6. Section eighty-seven A of said chapter one hundred and eleven is hereby repealed.

SECTION 7. Chapter six hundred and forty of the acts of nineteen hundred and sixty-six is hereby repealed.

SECTION 8. The trustees of the Bristol county hospital shall, within forty-five days after the effective date of this act, proceed to sell all the assets of the Bristol county hospital and nursing home for the aging and shall invite bids for the purchase of said property, setting forth the last day for the receipt of such bids and the time and place for the opening of all such bids, after notice of such sale has been published once a week for three successive weeks in a daily newspaper having a general circulation in Bristol county, the last such publication being at least seven days before the final date for the receipt of bids.
