

whom shall be designated by the chief justice as chief court officer of said court for criminal business and one as an assistant chief court officer, nor five for civil business, one of whom shall be designated by said chief justice as chief court officer of said court for civil business; in the municipal court of the Dorchester district seven court officers may be appointed, of whom one shall be designated by the justice of said court as chief court officer and one assistant chief court officer; in the municipal court of the Roxbury district seven court officers may be appointed; in the third district court of eastern Middlesex and the central district court of Worcester five court officers may be appointed; in the district court of Springfield four court officers may be appointed; in the municipal court of the West Roxbury district, in the district court of Somerville, in the district court of East Norfolk and in the fourth district court of eastern Middlesex three court officers may be appointed; in the third district court of Bristol, in the municipal court of the South Boston district, of the Charlestown district, the East Boston district court, the district court of Chelsea, the first district court of eastern Middlesex, the second district court of eastern Middlesex, the district court of Newton and the district court of northern Norfolk two court officers for each court may be appointed; and in each of the other district courts in the commonwealth one court officer may be appointed.

Chap. 586. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE LICENSING BOARD FOR THE CITY OF NEW BEDFORD TO TRANSFER THE LICENSE TO SELL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES HELD BY PILOT HOUSE OF NEW BEDFORD, INC. TO A CERTAIN OTHER LOCATION.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding the provisions of section sixteen C of chapter one hundred and thirty-eight of the General Laws, but subject, however, to all other provisions of said chapter, the licensing board for the city of New Bedford is hereby authorized to transfer the license to sell alcoholic beverages held by Pilot House of New Bedford, Inc. to a location at the southeast corner of Howland and South Second streets in said city.

Chap. 587. AN ACT RELATIVE TO REPRESENTATIVE TOWN GOVERNMENT BY LIMITED TOWN MEETINGS IN THE TOWN OF FAIRHAVEN.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 285 of the acts of 1930 is hereby amended by striking out, in line 5, the word "five" and inserting in place thereof the word: — two.

SECTION 2. The first sentence of section 4 of chapter 285 of the acts of 1930, as appearing in section 4 of chapter 589 of the acts of 1955, is hereby further amended by striking out, in lines 7 to 10, inclusive, the words: — "; provided that any town meeting member may become a candidate for reelection by giving written notice thereof to the town clerk at least forty-two days before election".

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
