Chap. 200. AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE ARRANGEMENT OF NAMES AND QUESTIONS ON CERTAIN VOTING MACHINES MAY BE THE SAME AS ON THE OFFICIAL PAPER BALLOT.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The first sentence of the second paragraph of section 33 of chapter 54 of the General Laws, as appearing in section 1 of chapter 238 of the acts of 1935, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "on", in line 10, the words: —; provided, however, that on any such voting machine which provides adequate mechanical safeguards, the names of candidates and the questions to be submitted to the voters may be arranged in the same manner as on the official paper ballot.

Chap. 201. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE EMPLOYMENT OF CERTAIN FEMALES AT FIVE O'CLOCK IN THE MORNING IN BAKERIES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The first paragraph of section 59 of chapter 149 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after the word "employed", in line 4, as appearing in chapter 448 of the acts of 1965, the words: — in a bakery commencing at five o'clock in the morning; and provided, further, that such a female may be employed.

Chap. 202. AN ACT INCREASING THE PENALTY FOR A SECOND CONVICTION OF THE CRIME OF UNAUTHORIZED USE OF A MOTOR VEHICLE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The first sentence of paragraph (a) of subdivision (2) of section 24 of chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after the word "shall", in line 22, as appearing in chapter 316 of the acts of 1966; the words: — for the first offense, — and by inserting after the word "both", in line 24, the words: —, and for a subsequent offense by imprisonment in the state prison for not more than five years or in a house of correction for not more than two and one half years, or by a fine of not more than one thousand dollars, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Chap. 203. AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE OPENING OF POLLS AT STATE ELECTIONS IN TOWNS WITH A POPULATION OF LESS THAN FIVE HUNDRED.
