

Chap. 212. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE LICENSE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE TO ESTABLISH CERTAIN LICENSE FEES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the fees to be charged by the city of Cambridge for the issuance of the following licenses shall be such as may be established from time to time by the license commission of said city: auctioneers, common victualers and lodging houses.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 213. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TRANSPORT OF CERTAIN GOODS ON LEGAL HOLIDAYS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The first paragraph of section 14 of chapter 136 of the General Laws, as amended by chapter 293 of the acts of 1964, is hereby further amended by inserting after the first sentence the following sentence:— The transport of goods in commerce, or for a consideration, through two or more cities or towns by a motor truck or trailer, may be allowed on any legal holiday to which the provisions of sections five to eleven, inclusive, apply, if the commissioner of public safety is satisfied that such transport could not be performed on any other day without serious suffering, loss, damage or public inconvenience, and has issued a permit for such transport, after notice to the chief of police or the head or other officer in charge of the police department of any city or town through which a permit to transport such goods has been requested, or to the board of selectmen of any such town having no established police department.

Chap. 214. AN ACT PLACING THE OFFICE OF CUSTODIAN OF TOWN HALL AND POLICE STATION IN THE TOWN OF MILFORD UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The office of custodian of town hall and police station in the town of Milford shall, upon the effective date of this act, be subject to the civil service law and rules; provided, however, that the incumbent of said office on said effective date shall be subjected to a noncompetitive qualifying examination for said office by the division of civil service. If said incumbent passes said examination, he shall be certified for said office and shall be deemed to be permanently appointed thereto without serving any probationary period, and his tenure of office shall be unlimited, subject, however, to the provisions of said law. If he fails to pass said examination, he may continue to serve in said office, but shall not be subject to said civil service law and rules.

Chap. 215. AN ACT PLACING THE OFFICE OF SUPERINTENDENT OF MILFORD MEDICAL HOME IN THE TOWN OF MILFORD UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:
