

trading, money management and certificate delivery; and no director or officer shall receive, in addition to his fixed salary or compensation from such company, any money or valuable thing, either directly or indirectly, for negotiating, procuring, recommending or aiding in any purchase, sale or loan made by such company in connection with its investments, nor shall he have any substantial interest, direct or indirect, in any such purchase, sale or loan, except that, if a policyholder, he shall be entitled to all the benefits accruing under the terms of his contract.

Chap. 280. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE ALTERATION, FORGERY AND POSSESSION OF CERTAIN FISHING, HUNTING AND TRAPPING LICENSES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter 131 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 33, as appearing in section 1 of chapter 802 of the acts of 1967, and inserting in place thereof the following section: —

Section 33. A person shall not alter, forge or counterfeit any license, permit, permit application or certificate issued under any provision of this chapter, nor possess or use any such altered, forged or counterfeited license, permit, permit application or certificate, nor procure or attempt to procure a license, permit, permit application or certificate by fraud or false statements of any kind, nor use or attempt to use any license, permit, permit application or certificate of another, nor loan or allow another person to use his license, permit, permit application or certificate.

Chap. 281. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF FOXBOROUGH TO APPOINT CERTAIN APPLICANTS AS POLICE OFFICERS IN SAID TOWN WHO DO NOT MEET THE MINIMUM HEIGHT REQUIREMENT.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding the provisions of law to the contrary regulating the minimum height of police officers, the director of civil service shall certify, in accordance with the civil service law and rules, and the town of Foxborough may appoint, as a police officer, any applicant who passed the written examination for police officers held August twenty-third, nineteen hundred and sixty-eight and who meets all other requirements other than the minimum height of five feet seven inches.

Chap. 282. AN ACT REQUIRING THAT OWNERS OF MOTOR VEHICLES SHALL REMOVE CERTAIN VISIBLE EVIDENCE FURNISHED BY THE REGISTRAR RELATIVE TO THE VALIDITY OF PLATES IN USE ON SAID VEHICLES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 2A the following section: —
