Chap. 299. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE GRANTING OF LICENSES FOR THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES BY CERTAIN RESTAURANTS IN THE TOWN OF LEXINGTON.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The state secretary shall cause to be placed on the official ballot used in the town of Lexington at each biennial state election the following subdivision to the question which he is required under the provisions of section eleven of chapter one hundred and thirty-eight of the General Laws to place on the official ballot in all cities and towns and, under the provisions of chapter six hundred and seventy-nine of the acts of nineteen hundred and sixty-eight, in the town of Lexington at such elections, to wit: —

F. Shall licenses be granted in the town of Lexington for the sale therein of all alcoholic beverages by restaurants having a dining room capacity of not less than ninety-nine persons?

If a majority of the votes cast in said town in answer to subdivision F is in the affirmative, said town shall, irrespective of the results of the votes in answer to subdivisions A, B, C, D and E be taken to authorize for the two calendar years next succeeding, the sale in said town of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises of restaurants having a dining room capacity of not less than ninety-nine persons, in accordance with the provisions of said chapter one hundred and thirty-eight.

Chap. 300. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF PROVINCETOWN TO BORROW MONEY FOR HARBOR IMPROVEMENT PURPOSES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The town of Provincetown may borrow from time to time such sums as may be necessary not exceeding, in the aggregate, the sum of three hundred and eighty thousand dollars, and may issue bonds and notes therefor, which shall bear on their face the words, Town of Provincetown Harbor Improvements Loan, Act of 1969, to pay the town's share of the cost of the improvement of its harbor by the construction pursuant to section twenty-nine of chapter ninety-one of the General Laws of a breakwater of stone or concrete. Each such issue shall constitute a separate loan and each such loan shall be paid in not more than twenty years from its date. Indebtedness incurred under this act shall not be subject to approval as required by section two of chapter seventy-four of the acts of nineteen hundred and forty-five, as amended, but shall be in excess of the statutory limit and shall, except as provided herein, be subject to the provisions of chapter forty-four of the General Laws, exclusive of the limitations contained in the first paragraph of section seven thereof.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
