

Section 53. If a town, regional school district, or a district as defined in section one A, or any of its officers or agents are about to raise or expend money or incur obligations purporting to bind said town, regional school district, or district for any purpose or object or in any manner other than that for and in which such town, regional school district, or district has the legal and constitutional right and power to raise or expend money or incur obligations, the supreme judicial or superior court may, upon petition of not less than ten taxable inhabitants of the town, or not less than ten taxable inhabitants of any town in the regional school district, or not less than ten taxable inhabitants of that portion of a town which is in the district, determine the same in equity, and may, before the final determination of the cause, restrain the unlawful exercise or abuse of such corporate power.

Chap. 508. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE EXPENSES OF THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION IN CHIROPODY (PODIATRY).

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 12C of chapter 13 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by section 17 of chapter 801 of the acts of 1963, is hereby further amended by striking out, in line 7, the words “, and the expenses of the board,”.

Chap. 509. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE RETIREMENT BOARD OF THE CITY OF LAWRENCE TO ACCEPT A LATE NOTICE OF A PERSONAL INJURY SUSTAINED BY MICHAEL J. REID.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the retirement board of the city of Lawrence is hereby authorized and directed to accept written notice from the head of the health department of said city of the time, place, cause and nature of the personal injury to Michael J. Reid, a former employee of said department. Such notice shall have the same force and effect and be considered on the same basis as if it had been seasonably filed in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (b) of subdivision (3) of section seven of chapter thirty-two of the General Laws.

Chap. 510. AN ACT REPEALING THE LAW PLACING THE OFFICE OF SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS OF THE TOWN OF CHESHIRE UNDER CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter twenty-five of the acts of nineteen hundred and fifty-seven is hereby repealed.
