

**Chap. 511.** AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF WINCHESTER TO PAY AN ORDINARY RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE TO JOHN S. PEARSON, A FORMER FIRE FIGHTER OF SAID TOWN.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the town of Winchester is hereby authorized to pay to John S. Pearson, a former fire fighter of said town, an ordinary disability retirement allowance effective as of June third, nineteen hundred and sixty-one, under the provisions of section six of chapter thirty-two of the General Laws. Said allowance shall be computed on the basis of the law applicable as of June third, nineteen hundred and sixty-one and the retirement benefits applicable as of that date which would have applied had said John S. Pearson then filed for such an allowance and had the same been approved by the retirement board of the town of Winchester.

**Chap. 512.** AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF FALL RIVER TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR THE PAYMENT OF AND TO PAY, A CERTAIN UNPAID BILL.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The city of Fall River is hereby authorized to appropriate and pay to Everett Lafleur, doing business as Lafleur's Oil Company, the sum of three hundred and eighty-eight dollars and ninety-six cents for diesel oil delivered to the highway division of the department of public works of said city in the year nineteen hundred and sixty-eight.

SECTION 2. No bill shall be approved by the city auditor of said city for payment or paid by the treasurer thereof under authority of this act unless and until a certificate has been signed and filed with said city auditor, stating under the penalties of perjury that the goods, materials or services for which said bill was submitted were ordered by an official or an employee of said city, and that such goods and materials were delivered and actually received by said city or that such services were rendered to said city, or both.

SECTION 3. Any person who knowingly files a certificate required by section two which is false, and who thereby receives payment for goods, materials or services which were not received by or rendered to said city, shall be punished by imprisonment for not more than one year or by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars, or both.

**Chap. 513.** AN ACT PROVIDING THAT MEMBERS OF THE JUDICIARY MAY, AFTER TWENTY YEARS SERVICE, RETIRE ON PENSION AFTER ATTAINING AGE SIXTY-FIVE.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 65A of chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the second paragraph, as most recently
