

ful drugs, articles, implements or other paraphernalia used in, for, or in connection with the unlawful possession or use of any harmful drug are found therein to seize and securely keep the same, until final action, and to arrest the person in possession thereof, and to return forthwith the warrant with his doings thereon to a district court having jurisdiction in the town where said drug is alleged to be kept or deposited.

For the purposes of this section, the term "harmful drug" shall mean and include any compound or derivative of barbituric acid, amphetamines, ergot or any hypnotic or somnifacient drug.

Chap. 587. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE REGISTRATION OF CERTAIN ALIENS AS BARBERS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 87H of chapter 112 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by chapter 490 of the acts of 1963, is hereby further amended by adding the following three paragraphs:—

Every applicant for a license shall furnish evidence that he is a citizen of the United States or shall present to the board a copy of his declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States, certified by the clerk of the court in which it was filed, or a certificate from the Immigration and Naturalization Service of the United States, showing that, in accordance with law, he has declared his intention to become such citizen, and no license shall be issued to an applicant who fails to comply with these provisions. Unless an applicant who is an alien and who is subsequently licensed presents to the board his completed naturalization papers showing that he is a citizen of the United States within five years following the filing of the copy or certificate hereinbefore referred to his license shall be revoked.

Every alien shall first serve as an apprentice for at least three years under the supervision of a registered barber before being eligible to take the examination for a fully registered barber. An alien shall not be allowed to take the apprentice examination unless his passport states that he is a barber and he presents two affidavits satisfactory to the board stating that he is at least eighteen years of age and that he has been a barber for at least two years in a foreign country. This examination shall consist of a haircut, shampoo, shave, face massage and scalp massage.

The apprentice examination fee shall be twenty-five dollars and he shall be entitled to two reexaminations within the year at a fee of fifteen dollars each. The apprentice license shall expire one year from the date of issue and may be renewed annually for a fee of ten dollars.

Chap. 588. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OR RENEWAL OF A BARBER CERTIFICATE FOR A TWO YEAR PERIOD.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The second paragraph of section 87H of chapter 112 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the second, third and fourth

sentences and inserting in place thereof the following three sentences:—Each such certificate of registration issued by the board shall expire on December thirty-first of the second year following the date of its issue. The board may renew any such registration, and issue a certificate thereof, upon the payment of a renewal fee of fifteen dollars. Any person holding a certificate or renewal certificate which has expired may have such certificate or renewal certificate reinstated within one year of the date of expiration upon payment of a fee of twenty dollars.

Chap. 589. AN ACT RELATIVE TO EXPENDITURES FOR THE CARE, MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR OF NORFOLK COUNTY HOSPITAL.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The county commissioners of Norfolk county are hereby authorized to expend for the year nineteen hundred and sixty-nine the sums set forth in this act for the care, maintenance and repair of the Norfolk county hospital, and to assess the same in the manner set forth in section eighty-five of chapter one hundred and eleven of the General Laws.

The sums set forth are based upon detailed schedules approved by the joint committee on counties, copies of which are deposited with the director of accounts.

Said director shall file with said county commissioners and with the county treasurer a certification of the amounts set forth in the approved schedules for such hospitals. Except as provided by this act or except as otherwise provided by law, no liability may be incurred and no expenditure shall be made in excess of the amount available in an existing main group, a class or a subclass.

Transfers from a main group to another main group may be made upon written request of said county commissioners with the written approval of the director of accounts and copies of said request and approval shall be filed with the county treasurer; provided, however, that no transfer shall be made from the main groups "personal services", "equipment", "structures and improvements" or "improvements to land" to another main group nor shall any transfer be made from any other main group into any of the aforementioned main groups.

Transfers within an appropriation between classes and between subclasses within a main group may be made by said county commissioners whenever in their opinion public necessity and convenience so requires; provided, however, that no transfer shall be made within the classes of the main groups "personal services" or "equipment".

Amounts included for permanent positions in sums appropriated herein for personal services are based upon schedules of permanent positions and salary rates as approved by the joint committee on counties, and, except as otherwise shown by the files of said committee, a copy of which shall be deposited with the county personnel board, no part of sums so appropriated shall be available for payment of salaries of any additional permanent positions, or for payments on account of reallocations of permanent positions, or for payments on account of any change of salary range or compensation of any permanent positions, notwithstanding any special or general law to the contrary; except that an attendant who becomes a licensed practical nurse and a graduate
