

Chap. 287. AN ACT INCREASING THE AMOUNT OF PROPERTY THAT MAY BE HELD BY WHEELOCK COLLEGE.*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Wheelock College, a charitable corporation, organized and existing under chapter one hundred and eighty of the General Laws, is hereby authorized to hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding ten million dollars; and no gift, devise, bequest or conveyance of real or personal estate heretofore made to said corporation shall be invalid by reason of the limit heretofore imposed by law upon the amount of such estate allowed to be held by it.

DEAR MR. SECRETARY:— I, Francis W. Sargent, pursuant to the provisions of Article XLVIII of the Amendments to the Constitution, the Referendum II, Emergency Measures, hereby declare in my opinion the immediate preservation of the public convenience requires that the law being Chapter 287 of the Acts of 1970, entitled "AN ACT INCREASING THE AMOUNT OF PROPERTY THAT MAY BE HELD BY WHEELOCK COLLEGE," and the enactment of which received my approval on May 13, 1970, should take effect forthwith.

I further declare that in my opinion said law is an emergency law and the facts constituting the emergency are as follows:

An application for a \$90,000 loan for construction of academic facilities under Title III of the Federal Higher Education Facilities Act of 1967 has been approved for Wheelock College to enable them to permanently finance recently remodelled faculty offices at a favorable interest cost of 3% per annum. In order that the Federal funds for this project may be realized without unnecessary delay, I deem this to be an emergency law.
