

Laws, or acquire by purchase or otherwise, and hold all lands, rights of way and other easements within the limits of said town which may be necessary for effectuating the purposes of this act.

SECTION 3. For the purposes of carrying out the provisions of section one, said town may appropriate, from time to time, such sums as may be necessary therefor.

SECTION 4. All monies received by the board of selectmen from the sale of steam, authorized by section one, shall be deposited with the treasurer of said town and held as a separate account and may be expended by said board after appropriation for the purpose of reducing the indebtedness incurred in constructing said incinerator, or for its maintenance and repair.

SECTION 5. Any action taken at the special town meeting held on May twenty-eight, nineteen hundred and seventy pursuant to the authorization contained in this act is hereby validated and confirmed as though this act were in effect at the time of the posting of the warrant for said meeting.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 486. AN ACT DESIGNATING A TRAFFIC CIRCLE IN THE SOUTH BOSTON DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF BOSTON AS GENERAL CASIMIR PULASKI CIRCLE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The traffic circle located on Mount Vernon street in the South Boston district of the city of Boston, on land owned by the metropolitan district commission, shall be designated and known as the General Casimir Pulaski circle. A suitable marker bearing said designation shall be erected and maintained at said circle by said commission.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

Chap. 487. AN ACT DIRECTING THE MIDDLESEX COUNTY RETIREMENT BOARD TO GRANT A PENSION TO RICHARD N. FARRELL.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of law and for the purpose of promoting the public good and in recognition of meritorious service, the Middlesex county retirement board is hereby authorized and directed to pay to Richard N. Farrell, a police sergeant of the town of Stow, who sustained serious injury in the line of duty, an annual retirement allowance equal to the salary he would have been entitled to receive had he continued in the service of the police department of said town.

SECTION 2. In the event of the death of Richard N. Farrell, as the result of said injury, his widow shall be entitled to receive the same benefit as is payable to said Richard N. Farrell at the time of his death, such benefit to be payable for life or until she remarries.

SECTION 3. The Middlesex county retirement board is hereby further authorized and directed to pay to said Richard N. Farrell the accumulated total deductions credited to his account in the annuity savings fund of the Middlesex county retirement system.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 488. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SALARY OF THE INCUMBENT OF THE OFFICE OF SECOND ASSISTANT CLERK OF THE BOSTON JUVENILE COURT.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, service as an employee of the general court shall be credited to the incumbent of the office of second assistant clerk of the Boston juvenile court in determining the step-in-range of said incumbent.

Chap. 489. AN ACT INCREASING THE MAXIMUM PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The third paragraph of section 37 of chapter 92 of the General Laws, as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 2, the word "twenty" and inserting in place thereof the word: — fifty.

Chap. 490. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE DESIGNATION OF THE COMMISSIONER OF PROBATION AS A MEMBER, EX OFFICIO, OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE OF YOUTH SERVICES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 9 of chapter 18A of the General Laws, as appearing in section 1 of chapter 838 of the acts of 1969, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "correction", in lines 3 and 4, the words: —, the commissioner of probation.

Chap. 491. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RIGHTS OF CERTAIN SCHOOL PERSONNEL EMPLOYED BY REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 42B of chapter 71 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by chapter 389 of the acts of 1970, is hereby further amended by adding the following paragraph: —

Any employee subject to the provisions of chapter thirty-one, employed by the school committee of a town, whose position is superseded by reason of the establishment and operation of a regional school district shall be employed by the regional district school committee without loss of any civil service or other rights previously acquired by him.
