

certain at the same time the name, age or date of birth, occupation, nationality if not a citizen of the United States, and place of residence of every inhabitant of the commonwealth.

In taking said census the secretary of the commonwealth shall have the same powers, duties and assistance as are granted him under the General Laws for the taking of the decennial census.

Chap. 25. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE BOUNDARIES OF THE OXFORD-ROCHDALE SEWER DISTRICT TO INCLUDE CERTAIN LAND IN THE TOWN OF OXFORD.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 1 of chapter 250 of the acts of 1957 is hereby amended by striking out, in lines 6 to 9, inclusive, the words "the intersection of said town line with the north right-of-way of the new Massachusetts Turnpike; thence westerly along said north right-of-way line to its intersection with" and inserting in place thereof the words:— interstate route 20; thence westerly along said interstate route 20 to.

Chap. 26. AN ACT REMOVING THE LIMITATION OF THE COMPENSATION OF WORK RELEASE SUPERVISORS IN HOUSES OF CORRECTION.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 86F of chapter 127 of the General Laws, inserted by section 1 of chapter 821 of the acts of 1967, is hereby amended by striking out the fourth paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:—

The sheriff shall appoint a work release supervisor, whose duties shall consist of participant screening, employer interviewing, collection of monies, keeping of records, procurement of positions and similar duties assigned by the sheriff.

Chap. 27. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE ANNUAL OBSERVANCE OF ARMISTICE DAY.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter 6 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 15Q the following section:—

Section 15R. The governor shall annually issue a proclamation calling for a proper observance of November the eleventh as Armistice Day, in lasting recognition of the service and sacrifice of those sons and daughters of Massachusetts who served in the armed forces of the United States during World War I and in thanksgiving for the termination of hostilities on Armistice Day, November the eleventh, nineteen hundred and eighteen.
