

Chap. 57. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE OFFER BY CITIES AND TOWNS OF A REWARD FOR INFORMATION LEADING TO THE ARREST AND CONVICTION OF A PERSON MAKING A FALSE ALARM OF FIRE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 10 of chapter 276 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph: —

The aldermen or the selectmen may offer a reward of fifty dollars for information leading to the arrest and conviction of a person making or circulating or causing to be made or circulated a false alarm of fire.

Chap. 58. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR AN ADDITIONAL COURT OFFICER IN THE SECOND DISTRICT COURT OF EASTERN MIDDLESEX.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The first sentence of section 62 of chapter 218 of the General Laws, as appearing in chapter 841 of the acts of 1969, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "Middlesex", in line 21, the words: — , in the second district court of eastern Middlesex, — and by striking out, in line 27, the words "the second district court of eastern Middlesex,".

Chap. 59. AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE DISTRIBUTION OF VOTING LISTS IN CITIES AND TOWNS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 55 of chapter 51 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the fifth sentence, as appearing in chapter 255 of the acts of 1950, and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: — All first voting lists shall be printed and available for public distribution not later than the first day of July in state election years.

Chap. 60. AN ACT AUTHORIZING TRAPPING BY CERTAIN MINORS WHEN ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 14 of chapter 131 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the fourth paragraph, as appearing in section 1 of chapter 802 of the acts of 1967, and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph: —

Nothing in this section or any other provision of law shall prohibit a minor twelve to fourteen years of age, inclusive, from participating in the hunting of birds and mammals or in trapping when accompanied by a duly licensed adult and, in the case of trapping, within sight of such adult; provided, that the bag limit established by law or regulation for one person shall not be exceeded; and provided, further, that only one firearm shall be used in such hunting. Not more than one such minor shall at any one time accompany one adult, and such minors shall not be required to be licensed.
