Chap. 324. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF QUINCY TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR THE PAYMENT OF, AND TO PAY, CERTAIN SUMS TO CERTAIN FEMALE NURSES AIDES EMPLOYED AT THE QUINCY CITY HOSPITAL.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding any contrary provision of law, the city council of the city of Quincy is hereby authorized to appropriate a sum, not to exceed eighty thousand dollars, for the payment of, and after such appropriation the treasurer of said city is hereby authorized to pay, certain female nurses aides employed by the Quincy City Hospital from February the first, nineteen hundred and sixty-eight through December the thirty-first, nineteen hundred and seventy the sum to which each of them may be entitled under the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Amendments of 1966 (Public Law 89-601).

Chap. 325. AN ACT REQUIRING LICENSED WAREHOUSEMEN TO NOTIFY DEPOSITORS OF FAMILY, PERSONAL OR HOUSEHOLD GOODS THAT SUCH GOODS ARE NOT COVERED BY INSURANCE AGAINST FIRE OR THEFT.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 4 of chapter 105 of the General Laws, as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:—

Any warehouse receipt delivered to a depositor of family, personal or household goods shall contain the following notice conspicuously printed in at least eight point type: "The property which you are putting in storage is not covered by insurance against fire or theft. You may contact the warehouseman for instructions on placing insurance coverage for fire and theft on the deposited property."

Chap. 326. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATION OF CERTAIN FUNDS OF THE TOWN OF SOUTH HADLEY, PREVIOUSLY RAISED BY BOND ISSUE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding the provisions of section twenty of chapter forty-four of the General Laws, the town of South Hadley may, at an annual or special town meeting called for the purpose, by a two thirds vote of the town meeting members present and voting thereon, appropriate sums, not exceeding four hundred and ten thousand four hundred and twenty-eight dollars and twenty-six cents, in the aggregate, from the

proceeds of a loan issued November the first, nineteen hundred and sixty-eight, which proceeds are not presently necessary for the purposes specified in the authorization of said loan, for any purpose for which said town may be authorized to borrow for a period of twenty years or longer.

Chap. 327. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF TOPSFIELD TO PURCHASE LAND IN THE TOWN OF BOXFORD FOR CONSERVATION PURPOSES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The town of Topsfield is hereby authorized to purchase for conservation purposes the following described parcel of land situated in the town of Boxford: — A certain parcel of land consisting of 7.9 acres and being shown as Lot C on a Plan entitled, "Plan of Property Bordering Pye Brook, Topsfield, Compiled for the Town of Topsfield, from old surveys and aerial photograph, C. Lawrence Bond, Reg'd Surveyor, December, 1970. Scale 1 in, equals 200 ft."; said Plan being on file with the town clerk of the town of Boxford.

Chap. 328. AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE THE THIRTIETH, NINETEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-ONE TO PROVIDE FOR SUPPLEMENTING CERTAIN EXISTING APPROPRIATIONS AND FOR CERTAIN NEW ACTIVITIES AND PROJECTS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. To provide for supplementing certain items in the general appropriation act and for certain new activities and projects, the sums set forth in section two of this act are hereby appropriated from the General Fund unless specifically designated otherwise in the item, subject to the provisions of law regulating the disbursement of public funds and the conditions pertaining to appropriations in chapter four hundred and eighty of the acts of nineteen hundred and seventy for the fiscal year ending June the thirtieth, nineteen hundred and seventy-one, or for such period as may be specified, the sums so appropriated to be in addition to any amounts at present available for the purposes.
