**Chap. 372.** AN ACT PROVIDING TENURE OF OFFICE FOR JEREMIAH KAMENS, INCUMBENT OF THE OFFICE OF CLERK OF COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF CHELSEA.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

The tenure of office of Jeremiah Kamens, incumbent of the office of clerk of committees of the board of aldermen of the city of Chelsea, shall, upon the effective date of this act, be unlimited, but he may be removed therefrom for cause after a hearing in the manner provided by section forty-three of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

**Chap. 373.** AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE VISITATION RIGHTS OF MIGRANT WORKERS LIVING IN QUARTERS APART FROM THE LIVING QUARTERS OF THEIR EMPLOYER.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section 128H of chapter 111 of the General Laws, inserted by section 5A of chapter 718 of the acts of 1967, is hereby amended by striking out the third sentence and inserting in place thereof the following three sentences:—A worker living in quarters apart from the living quarters of his employer shall have reasonable rights of visitation in his living quarters outside of regular working hours and the certificate of occupancy issued by the department shall include notification, in English and in Spanish, of said rights. The department shall establish, by promulgation of regulations, such minimum standards relating to the rights of visitation under this section as will ensure the adequate protection of said rights. The superior court shall have jurisdiction in equity upon petition brought by the department in the name of the commonwealth to restrain and enjoin violations of this, or of section one hundred and twenty-eight G, or regulations promulgated thereunder.

DEAR MR. SECRETARY:—I, Francis W. Sargent, pursuant to the provisions of Article XLVIII of the Amendments to the Constitution, the Referendum II, Emergency Measures, hereby declare in my opinion the immediate preservation of the public convenience requires that the law being Chapter 373 of the Acts of 1971, entitled "AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE VISITATION RIGHTS OF MIGRANT WORKERS

LIVING IN QUARTERS APART FROM THE LIVING QUARTERS OF THEIR EMPLOYER.” and the enactment of which received my approval on June 3, 1971, should take effect forthwith.

I further declare that in my opinion said law is an emergency law and the facts constituting the emergency are as follows:

In order that the act may be effective in protecting visitation rights of migrant workers during the current agricultural season.

**Chap. 374.** AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF PALMER TO CONVEY CERTAIN PARK LAND TO THE WING MEMORIAL HOSPITAL ASSOCIATION FOR HOSPITAL PURPOSES.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

The town of Palmer is hereby authorized to sell and convey to the Wing Memorial Hospital Association certain park land to be used for hospital purposes, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a concrete bound on the Southerly side of the Massachusetts Turnpike Authority at the Northeasterly corner of land of the Palmer Housing Authority, as shown on a plan recorded in Hampden County Registry of Deeds, Plan 119, Page 118 & 119, and runs thence:

Easterly in a curve to the right with a radius of 4780.00 feet, a length of 138.98 feet along the Southerly side of said Massachusetts Turnpike Authority, to a stone bound set to mark Baseline STA 188 + 75.26 of said Massachusetts Turnpike Authority; thence turning and running

N. 85° 8' 30" E 330.06 feet along said last named land to a stone bound set to mark — Baseline STA 193 + 00.00 of said Massachusetts Turnpike Authority; thence turning and running

S. 4° 32' 30" E 59.95 feet along said last named land to a stone bound at land of Wing Memorial Hospital Association; thence turning and running

S. 84° 6' 10" W. 462.78 feet along said last named land and land of C. F. & I. Corporation to a point at land of Palmer Housing Authority as aforesaid; thence turning and running

N. 9° 58' 34" W 67.23 feet along said last named land to the point of beginning, and containing 29.847 square feet of land, more or less.
