

# HOUSE . . . . No. 613

By Mr. Iris of Brockton, petition of the Massachusetts Cosmetology School Owners Association relative to the practice of hairdressing and manicuring by students or apprentices under the law regulating the occupation of hairdressing. Public Health.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-One.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PRACTICE OF HAIRDRESSING  
OR MANICURING BY STUDENTS OR APPRENTICES UNDER  
THE LAW REGULATING THE OCCUPATION OF HAIR-  
DRESSING.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section eighty-seven U of chapter one hundred  
2 and twelve of the General Laws, as amended by  
3 section two of chapter three hundred and eighty-five  
4 of the acts of nineteen hundred and thirty-seven, is  
5 hereby further amended by inserting after the word  
6 "customer" in the eleventh line the following:—  
7 ; provided, that no customer shall be deemed a  
8 paying customer if paying only for materials used,—  
9 so as to read as follows: — *Section 87U.* - All students  
10 enrolled in registered schools and all apprentices  
11 employed or studying in registered shops shall, within  
12 fifteen days after entering upon their courses of study,  
13 be registered with the board by such schools or shops.

14 Students at registered schools and apprentices at  
15 registered shops may, within such fifteen day period,  
16 register with the board. No fee shall be required for  
17 such registration. No student or apprentice shall  
18 practice hairdressing or manicuring upon any paying  
19 customer, except to assist a registered hairdresser or  
20 operator who is working on such customer; provided,  
21 that no customer shall be deemed a paying customer  
22 if paying only for materials used. A school or shop-  
23 shall not pay a student for any services rendered by  
24 him. The board shall make such reasonable rules  
25 and regulations as may be necessary to insure a  
26 proper course of training for apprentices in shops.
