### AN ACT PROHIBITING THE CHANGING OF ORDERS GIVEN BY A CUSTOMER.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 General Laws, chapter ninety-four, section three  
2 hundred and six, is hereby amended by inserting  
3 after the word "brand" in line four of said section,  
4 as appearing in General Laws, Tercentenary Edition,  
5 the following clause:— or whoever alters or changes  
6 an order given by a customer, — so as to read as  
7 follows:—

8 Unless another penalty is provided in this chapter,  
9 whoever counterfeits any brand required by this  
10 chapter or whoever, without authority marks or  
11 brands any article required to be inspected, or marks  
12 or brands such article with a counterfeited brand, or  
13 whoever alters or changes an order given by a cus-  
14 tomer, shall be punished by a fine of not more than

15 two hundred dollars; and whoever alters or defaces  
16 any marks or brands made by an inspector of milk or  
17 collector of samples of milk under this chapter, unless  
18 another penalty is provided, shall be punished by a  
19 fine of not more than twenty-five dollars.
