

HOUSE No. 2105

Mr. Lane of Quincy presented a petition of Myron N. Lane that the Metropolitan District Commission be authorized to lay out and construct a traffic separation between Neponset Bridge and Quincy Shore Boulevard in Quincy. Metropolitan Affairs.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO LAY OUT AND CONSTRUCT A TRAFFIC SEPARATION BETWEEN THE NEPONSET BRIDGE AND THE JUNCTION OF QUINCY SHORE BOULEVARD AND HANCOCK STREET IN THE CITY OF QUINCY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The metropolitan district commission,
2 hereinafter called the commission, is hereby author-
3 ized and directed to lay out and construct a traffic
4 separation for vehicular traffic between the Neponset
5 bridge and the junction of Quincy Shore boulevard and
6 Hancock street in the city of Quincy, with such suit-
7 able alterations in connecting ways in said city as the
8 commission may deem necessary.

1 SECTION 2. The commission may, on behalf of the
2 commonwealth, take by eminent domain under chap-

3 ter seventy-nine of the General Laws, or acquire by
4 purchase or otherwise, such public or private lands
5 as it may deem necessary for carrying out the pur-
6 poses of this act.

1 SECTION 3. The entire cost of the work authorized
2 herein, including any damages awarded or paid on
3 account of any taking of land or property therefor
4 or any injury to the same, and any sums paid for lands
5 or rights purchased, including also such other ex-
6 penses incurred in carrying out the provisions of sec-
7 tion one, shall be paid by the commonwealth from
8 such appropriations as may hereafter be made from
9 the Highway Fund.

1 SECTION 4. When the work authorized by section
2 one shall have been completed, the title to or control
3 of such lands or rights therein taken or acquired
4 therefor and said traffic separation shall be under the
5 control of and maintained by the commission.

1 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
