## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-One.

### RESOLVE RELATIVE TO CERTAIN IMPROVEMENTS IN WOODS HOLE, GREAT HARBOR, FALMOUTH, MASSACHUSETTS.

1 *Resolved*, That, after an appropriation has been  
2 made there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury  
3 of the Commonwealth for the improvement of Woods  
4 Hole, Great Harbor in accordance with a project of  
5 the Federal Government twelve thousand dollars;  
6 provided, however, that no part of this amount shall  
7 be expended until the Congress of the United States  
8 shall have appropriated the sum of twenty-four  
9 thousand dollars for the improvement aforesaid, and  
10 the Town of Falmouth shall have appropriated and  
11 paid into the State Treasury the sum of six thousand  
12 dollars as a contribution toward the cost of said im-  
13 provement, shall have provided a suitable public  
14 landing and shall have assumed liability, in the manner  
15 provided by section twenty-nine of Chapter ninety-  
16 one of the General Laws, as appearing in the Ter-  
17 centenary Edition, for all damages that may be  
18 incurred hereunder.

19 When Congress shall have made the appropriation  
20 and the Town of Falmouth its contribution and  
21 agreements, the twelve thousand dollars hereby pro-  
22 vided shall be placed to the credit of the Secretary  
23 of War of the United States as a cash deposit, for the  
24 improvement of Woods Hole Great Harbor.
