By Mr. Winslow of Cambridge, petition of Henry D. Winslow relative to the retirement allowance of Harry A. Penniman, a former employee of the city of Cambridge. Pensions.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-One.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE OF
HARRY A. PENNIMAN, A FORMER EMPLOYEE OF THE
CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The retirement allowance payable by
2 the city of Cambridge to Harry A. Penniman, who
3 was retired under the provisions of chapter four hun-
4 dred and fifty-three of the acts of nineteen hundred
5 and thirty-one on March twenty-fifth, nineteen
6 hundred and thirty-seven, after serving said city
7 faithfully as a registrar of voters and also as election
8 commissioner for more than nineteen years, may be
9 increased to an amount equal to one half the annual
10 compensation received by him at the time of his
11 retirement, any provision of said chapter four hundred
12 and fifty-three to the contrary notwithstanding; pro-
13 vided, that after said retirement allowance is in-
14 creased as aforesaid, said Penniman shall not be paid
15 for any service rendered to said city.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on December
2 thirty-first, nineteen hundred and forty-one, if ac-
3 cepted on or before said date by the city council of
4 said city, subject to the provisions of its charter, but
5 not otherwise.
