AN ACT REQUIRING THE CITY OF FALL RIVER TO TEMPORARILY REINSTATE JOSEPH M. CLEARY AS A LABORER FOR THE SOLE PURPOSE OF BEING RETIRED.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Joseph M. Cleary, who was employed for over
2 twenty-four years as a laborer in the service of the
3 city of Fall River and who became separated from
4 such service in the year nineteen hundred and twenty-
5 eight, by reason of inability to work on account of
6 disability arising out of and in the course of his em-
7 ployment, shall be reinstated by said city in its public
8 works department without further examination, but
9 for the sole purpose of being retired.

10 Upon his retirement as aforesaid there shall be
11 paid to him a pension at a rate equal to one half the
12 rate of annual compensation received by him at the
13 time of his separation from the classified labor service.
