AN ACT PROVIDING THAT KATHERINE I. LALLY MAY BE RE-EMPLOYED BY THE CLERK OF THE SUPERIOR COURT FOR CIVIL BUSINESS IN THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK AND PROVIDING FOR A CERTAIN RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE IN CASE SHE IS SO RE-EMPLOYED DURING THE CURRENT YEAR.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Katherine I. Lally, who was employed
2 in the office of the clerk of the superior court for civil
3 business in the county of Suffolk from nineteen hun-
4 dred and ten until her retirement on March first,
5 nineteen hundred and thirty-eight, may be re-em-
6 ployed by said clerk, and if, within the current year
7 she is so re-employed and shall thereupon pay into
8 the annuity savings fund of the Boston retirement
9 system a sum equal to the amount she would have
10 paid had she continued in employment in said office,
11 her former retirement shall be cancelled and upon
12 her final retirement she shall be entitled to the re-
13 tirement allowance to which she would have been
14 entitled had her service been continuous.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
