## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

### AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE QUALIFICATIONS OF APPLICANTS FOR REGISTRATION AS PHARMACISTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section twenty-four of chapter one  
2 hundred and twelve of the General Laws, as most re-  
3 cently amended by section one of chapter fifty-two  
4 of the acts of nineteen hundred and forty-one, is  
5 hereby further amended by striking out the first sen-  
6 tence and inserting in place thereof the following:—  
7 A person who desires to do business as a pharmacist  
8 shall, upon payment of five dollars to the board of  
9 registration in pharmacy, herein and in sections  
10 twenty-five to forty-two, inclusive, called the board,  
11 be entitled to examination; provided, that he shall  
12 have been graduated from a school or college of phar-  
13 macy approved by the board and the commissioner  
14 of education, or shall have had at least four years'  
15 experience in retail drug stores in this commonwealth.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on January  
2 first, nineteen hundred and forty-five.
