- 1 *Resolved*, A. Two Representatives to be desig-
- 2 nated by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 3 B. One of the committee to be a representative
- 4 of the Attorney-General's office.
- 5 C. For the purpose of investigating the circum-
- 6 stances surrounding a loan made by the Woburn
- 7 Co-operative Bank to George W. Braxton of Wake-
- 8 field, since deceased.
- 9 D. The property given to the bank as security
- 10 for the loan was purchased by Mr. and Mrs. Braxton
- 11 in the year 1896, Warranty Deed from Davis to
- 12 George W. Braxton, November 7.
- 13 E. The Braxtons accepting the mortgage which
- 14 was held by the Wakefield Co-operative Bank, Book
- 15 No. 1738, in the year 1900.

16 F. Mrs. Braxton put all of her personal earnings
17 in purchasing the land and paying the taxes to the
18 town of Wakefield.

19 G. The Petitioner claims in the original report
20 that they were deprived of their property without
21 due process of law; deprived of their constitutional
22 rights as quoted in original petitions; that parties
23 named in the original bills have used the Courts of
24 the Commonwealth to aid in —

25 (a) A conspiracy to conceal a fraud.

26 (b) To conceal perjury.

27 (c) And that their transaction is responsible for
28 the Petitioner's present situation and cause of filing
29 this bill.
