The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Three.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE EMPLOYMENT OF CERTAIN PERSONS BY LICENSEES CONDUCTING HORSE OR DOG RACING UNDER THE PARI-MUTUEL OR CERTIFICATE SYSTEM OF WAGERING.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would
2 tend to defeat its purpose, which is the preservation
3 of revenue to the commonwealth, therefore it is hereby
4 declared to be an emergency law necessary for the
5 immediate preservation of public welfare.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section ten of chapter one hundred and twenty-
2 eight A of the General Laws, as most recently amended
3 by chapter two hundred and sixty-eight of the acts
4 of nineteen hundred and thirty-six, is hereby further
5 amended by striking out the second sentence.
