The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Three.

AN ACT SUBJECTING TO THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS THE OFFICES AND POSITIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL EMPLOYMENT BUREAU OF THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The offices and positions of the municipi-
2 pal employment bureau of the city of Boston shall,
3 upon the effective date of this act, become subject to
4 the civil service laws and the rules and regulations
5 thereunder, and the terms of office of any incumbents
6 of said offices and positions shall be unlimited, sub-
7 ject to such laws; but the persons holding said
8 offices and positions on said effective date shall
9 respectively continue to serve therein without taking
10 a civil service examination.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
