AN ACT REPEALING THE PROVISIONS OF LAW AUTHORIZING
THE LICENSING AND CONDUCTING OF THE GAME COM-
MONLY CALLED BEANO.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Chapter two hundred and seventy-one of the Gen-
2 eral Laws is hereby amended by striking out section
3 twenty-two A, as most recently amended by chapters
4 two hundred and twenty-two and two hundred and
5 eighty-three of the acts of nineteen hundred and
6 thirty-six, and inserting in place thereof the fol-
7 lowing:—

8 *Section 22A.* Nothing in this chapter shall authorize
9 the prosecution, arrest or conviction of any person for
10 conducting or promoting, or for allowing to be con-
11 ducted or promoting, or for allowing to be conducted
12 or promoted, a game of cards commonly called whist
13 or bridge, in connection with which prizes are offered
14 to be won by chance; provided, that the entire pro-
15 ceeds of the charges for admission to such game are
16 donated solely to charitable, civic, educational, fra-
17 ternal or religious purposes.
