

HOUSE No. 1528

By Mr. Morley of Swampscott, petition of Lester B. Morley relative to retirement allowances of janitors of public school buildings in the town of Swampscott under the contributory retirement system of said town. Pensions.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO RETIREMENT ALLOWANCES OF JANITORS OF PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDINGS IN THE TOWN OF SWAMPSCOTT UNDER THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT SYSTEM OF SAID TOWN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Janitors of public school buildings in
2 the town of Swampscott who have been or will be
3 retired under the contributory retirement system of
4 said town shall receive a retirement allowance amount-
5 ing to one half the compensation received by them at
6 the time of retirement, notwithstanding any provi-
7 sion relating to said retirement system to the con-
8 trary.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted for ac-
2 ceptance to the voters of the town of Swampscott at
3 the annual town meeting in the year nineteen hun-

4 dred and forty-four in the form of the following ques-
5 tion which shall be placed upon the official ballot to
6 be used for the election of town officers at said meet-
7 ing: — “Shall an act passed by the general court in
8 the year nineteen hundred and forty-three, entitled,
9 ‘An Act relative to Retirement Allowances of Jani-
10 tors of Public School Buildings in the Town of Swamp-
11 scott under the Contributory Retirement System of
12 said Town,’ be accepted?” If a majority of the votes
13 in answer to said question is in the affirmative, then
14 this act shall thereupon take full effect, but not other-
15 wise.
