AN ACT EXTENDING THE TIME FOR ACCEPTANCE OF AN ACT TO ESTABLISH IN THE TOWN OF NATICK REPRESENTATIVE TOWN GOVERNMENT BY LIMITED TOWN MEETINGS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section thirteen of chapter two of the acts of nine-
2 teen hundred and thirty-eight is hereby amended by
3 striking out, in the fifth and sixth lines, the word
4 "five" and inserting in place thereof, in each instance
5 the word:— ten, — so as to read as follows:—
6 *Section 13.* If this act is rejected by the registered
7 voters of the town of Natick when first submitted
8 to said voters under section twelve, it may again
9 be submitted for acceptance in like manner from
10 time to time to such voters at any annual or special
11 town meeting within ten years, thereafter, but not
12 more than ten times in the aggregate, and, if accepted
13 by a majority of the voters voting thereon at such an
14 election, shall thereupon take effect for all purposes
15 incidental to the next annual town election in said
16 town, and shall take full effect beginning with said
17 election.
