By Mr. Rawson of Newton, petition of Stanley M. Bolster relative to the constitution of a quorum for the transaction of business by The Proprietors of Forest Hills Cemetery and relative to the investment of funds of said corporation. Mercantile Affairs.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE CONSTITUTION OF A QUORUM FOR THE TRANSACTION OF BUSINESS BY THE PROPRIETORS OF FOREST HILLS CEMETERY, AND RELATIVE TO THE INVESTMENT OF THE FUNDS OF SAID CORPORATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section six of chapter fifty-seven of
2 the acts of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight is hereby
3 amended by striking out, in the ninth line, the word
4 "persons" and inserting in place thereof the words:—
5 members, either present in person or represented by
6 proxy, — so as to read as follows:— *Section 6.* The
7 annual meetings of said corporation shall be held
8 on the fourth Monday of March in each year, at such
9 place in the city of Boston as the trustees shall direct,
10 and notices thereof, signed by the secretary, shall be
11 published in two or more of the newspapers printed
12 in Boston, at least seven days before the meeting;

13 special meetings may be called by order of the trustees
14 in the same manner. At all meetings of said corpora-
15 tion a quorum for business shall consist of not less
16 than fifteen members, either present in person or
17 represented by proxy, and any business may be
18 transacted, of which notice shall be given in the
19 advertisements for the meeting, and all questions
20 shall be decided by a majority of the members present
21 and represented, and voting either in person or by
22 proxy.

1 SECTION 2. The trustees of The Proprietors of
2 Forest Hills Cemetery are hereby authorized to invest
3 any funds in their hands in any securities or invest-
4 ments in which, under the law of the commonwealth,
5 trustees appointed by courts of the commonwealth
6 are now, or may hereafter be, authorized or permitted
7 to invest.

1 SECTION 3. So much of said chapter fifty-seven
2 of the acts of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, or
3 any act in amendment thereof or in addition thereto,
4 as is inconsistent with the provisions of this act, is
5 hereby repealed.
