AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE LONGY SCHOOL OF MUSIC, INCORPORATED, TO GRANT CERTAIN DEGREES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:
