RESOLUTIONS THAT THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND CONGRESS BE MEMORIALIZED TO THE END THAT MASSACHUSETTS SHALL BE ASSURED OF AN EQUITABLE APPORTIONMENT OF BUILDING MATERIALS WHICH MIGHT BE AVAILABLE FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF NEW HOUSING.

1 *Whereas*, There is a definite lack of housing ac-
2 commodations to accommodate the tremendous de-
3 mand for living quarters for the returning Veterans
4 of World War II; and

5 *Whereas*, Building materials in a nation wide scale
6 are inadequate to supply the full needs of all the
7 people, be it

8 *Resolved*, That the General Court of Massachusetts
9 hereby urgently petitions the Congress of the United
10 States in the name of all the citizens of this Com-
11 monwealth and particularly in the name of the re-
12 turning Veterans of World War II to take immediate
13 steps to the end that the Commonwealth of Massa-
14 chusetts shall secure an equitable apportionment of

15 the building materials in the United States that are
16 available for new housing; and be it further

17 *Resolved*, That the secretary of the Commonwealth
18 forthwith send copies of these resolutions to the
19 President of the United States and to the members
20 of Congress from Massachusetts.
