RESOLUTIONS MEMORIALIZING CONGRESS IN FAVOR OF
EXTENDING THE BENEFITS OF THE G. I. BILL OF RIGHTS,
SO CALLED, TO PERSONS WHO SERVED IN THE MERCHANT
MARINE OF THE UNITED STATES DURING WORLD WAR II.

1 *Resolved*, That the general court of Massachusetts
2 hereby urges the congress of the United States to
3 extend the benefits provided by the federal law known
4 as the Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944, and
5 also called the G I Bill of Rights, to persons who served
6 in the Merchant Marine of the United States during
7 World War II; and be it further

8 *Resolved*, That copies of these resolutions be sent
9 forthwith by the secretary of the commonwealth to
10 the president of the United States, to the presiding
11 officer of each branch of congress and to the members
12 thereof from this commonwealth.
